

What kind of experience do you have with public administration? I have worked in state government with 9 year a manager. I also obtained a Masters in Public Administration from Arizona State University in 2004. Output Description: O
2. Describe your interest in serving as a Hearing Officer. Include information not already mentioned about yourself, your experience, and background that supports your interest. My legal career has been almost wholly spent in administrative law. I have represented various entities in administrative proceedings before state utility commissions, including commission staff counsel, director of residential consumer advocacy offices, and as an attorney for regulated utilities. For two years while obtaining my MPA I managed the Arizona Supreme Court's attorney discipline program, which entailed the managing all administrative processes, including hearings before hearing officers. I served for 12 years as a volunteer hearing officer for Nevada's attorney discipline process, which including presiding over hearings to consider complaints of attorney misconduct.
3. A Hearing Officer appointed under this section should have a working knowledge of air quality issues arbitration, law and/or engineering. What specific education or experience do you have in these areas? I have been an attorney since 1978, and practiced or involved in administrative law for almost all of them. While not an engineer myself, I have worked with engineers and litigated engineering issues while employed with utility companies. This includes compliance with the National Electric Safety Code, and power plant operation and maintenance issues. I have not been involved directly with air quality issues, but certainly discussed them with fellow attorneys within my employers' legal departments.
