## A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CLARK COUNTY 2024 HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN AS THE DISTRICT'S HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, Clark County developed and implemented a multi-jurisdictional hazard mitigation plan (Mitigation Plan) in 2018 pursuant to the requirement of the federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, to submit a plan that identifies potential hazards, risks, and vulnerabilities which cause loss of property and life, economic hardship, and other threats to public health and safety;

WHEREAS, the 2018 mitigation plan was adopted by the Clark County Board of County Commissioners at the February 20, 2018, meeting, and Clark County submitted the Mitigation Plan to the State of Nevada and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA);

WHEREAS, to maintain eligibility for federal disaster assistance and certain grant funding opportunities, the Mitigation Plan has been updated in 2024 by the Clark County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security with support and participation of representatives from Clark County departments, local jurisdictions, and special districts within Clark County for the reduction of hazardous risk within our communities;

WHEREAS, the Plan specifically recommends hazard action plans and projects for Clark County Water Reclamation District (District) to mitigate risk of damage to the District's infrastructure and injury to staff in the event of a natural or human caused hazard; and

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2024, the Clark County Board of Commissioners adopted the Plan as the official Clark County Hazard Mitigation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees as follows:

- 1. The Clark County 2024 Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as the District's official Hazard Mitigation Plan and replaces the 2018 Clark County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan adopted by the Board of Trustees.
- 2. The District shall pursue implementation of the Plan's recommended hazard action plans applicable to the District.
- 3. The Plan will be revised and adopted by the District and the other participating agencies every five (5) years.
