I have supervised interns seeking licensure within the field, as well as teach college level courses. I currently work as a clinical supervisor for the City of Henderson's Mobile Crisis Intervention Team, who responds to behavioral health crises in the community, specifically those suffering from the impact of opioids. Through partnership with HIDTA (High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area), we are gathering data on overdoses and Narcan administration to strategize outreach, prevention, harm reduction and intervention efforts. I participate in summits, conferences, workshops and trainings to expand my knowledge of the opioid epidemic and share that information with community stakeholders in our joint efforts to combat the epidemic.

evaluations requested by the court. Being a member of the Residential Treatment Center (RTC) Placement Team, which is responsible for reviewing all cases where a youth is being recommended for placement in an RTC. With the entire team, determining if the placement is clinically appropriate at the current time, based on their past treatment history, their current diagnosis, and their current mental status. If placement is appropriate, determining which facility would best meet the needs of the child. If placement is not appropriate, determining what treatment level is clinically appropriate at the current time. Completing site reviews of all placements utilized by the Department, ensuring the facilities meet all requirements. Conducting emergency visits to sites as necessary when problems arise with placements. Completing clinical evaluations on youth for the purpose of recommending to the court the current clinical needs of the youth. Utilizing various psychometric tools and clinical interviews for drug and alcohol treatment needs, as well as general mental health concerns. Utilizing both the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders to provide the appropriate diagnosis, as well as the American Society of Addiction Medicine Patient Placement Criteria for appropriate diagnosing and treatment recommendations. Determining the appropriate treatment referrals and providing that referral information to the youth and their families. Completing risk assessments for violence potential and risk to the community on youth for the court, including evaluations specific to gun charges. Acting as the court representative for the Unit, speaking and answering questions regarding various cases in court when necessary. Supervising clinicians on the unit, as well as interns, part-time employees, and support staff, including completing one to one meetings, yearly evaluations, and keeping employees on course with yearly goals and assignments. Sitting in on interviews to fill various positions within the Clinical offices of the County, as well as reviewing applications to determine eligibility. Assigning cases to staff members, and reviewing court reports. Overseeing groups that are run by supervisees, including reviewing curriculum and policies and procedures. Establishing and conducting trainings in a variety of settings, including weekly trainings to new interns to the Clinical Services Unit, and monthly trainings to Probation on a variety of topics. Being available to Probation Officers for case consultations, questions, concerns, and being a general point of contact. Teaching new Probation Officers a variety of classes during the Peace Officer Standards and Training Academy. Conducting New Employee Orientation for the Department. Facilitating trainings in the community on the services and role of the Department of Juvenile Justice. I want to take this opportunity to express my interest in serving on the Regional Opioid Task Force (Task Force) created by Assembly Bill 132 of the 2023 Nevada Legislative Session. I believe my education, background, and training, as well as my current role as a clinical supervisor for the City of Henderson (City), align and complement the work and goals of the Task Force.

I am a dually licensed clinician, being both a Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor and a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT). For just over 20 years I worked in a clinical capacity for the Clark County Department of Juvenile Justice Services (DJJS). In that role, I worked with juveniles struggling with both mental health and substance misuse issues. Throughout my career at DJJS I also supervised interns seeking licensure in the field of both Marriage and Family Therapy, and Alcohol and Drug Counseling. Additionally, I have been teaching courses in this field at local colleges and universities for the past 10 years. These roles have granted me the advantage of being involved in both direct clinical practice, as well as training future generations of behavioral health professionals.

The City of Henderson applied for and was awarded a COSSUP (Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use Program) grant to establish a Mobile Crisis Intervention Team (MCIT). Henderson's MCIT is collaborating with the HIDTA (High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area) team to gather fatal and non-fatal overdose data, as well as data on the administration of Narcan by first responders. This information will assist in developing strategies for outreach, prevention, harm reduction and intervention. I was selected to supervise, design, and implement this new program focused on serving individuals in our community suffering behavioral health crises with a focus on those suffering from the impact of opioids.

The City is committed to improving our community's health and well-being including preventing and responding to the opioid crisis. The City debuted the Risk It All with Fentanyl awareness campaign and accompanying community toolkit last May via a regional summit. Henderson City Council approved the use of opioid settlement funds targeting youth prevention activities and approved licensed mental health professionals. The City has supported my participation in summits, conferences, workshops, and trainings to expand my knowledge of the opioid epidemic so that I could share that information with staff and community stakeholders.

I appreciate your consideration of my application and nomination by Mayor Michelle Romero for appointment to this Task Force. I look forward to serving the community of Clark County.

Honorable Board of Clark County Commissioners:

On behalf of the City of Henderson, I am pleased to provide this letter in support of Lisa Kelso's appointment to the Regional Opioid Task Force created by AB 132, which became law in June of this year.

Recognizing the opioid public health emergency, the City of Henderson (City), has taken several steps to educate, prevent and respond to the opioid crisis.

First, the City debuted the <u>Risk It All with Fentanyl awareness campaign</u> and accompanying community toolkit last May via a regional summit and speaker event led largely by the City's Community Development and Services Department and in collaboration with various public safety officials and local leadership. The campaign serves to raise awareness about the dangers of fentanyl and proliferation of counterfeit pills being laced and often marketed to our youth.

The Risk It All with Fentanyl Summit was so well received, Henderson City Council approved the use of opioid settlement funds targeting youth prevention activities. The campaign will ramp up again in FY23/24 and continue into the following fiscal year.

Lastly, the City applied for and was awarded a Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use Program (COSSUP) grant. This grant allowed for the creation and establishment of a Mobile Crisis Intervention Team (MCIT) to respond to individuals in our community suffering a behavioral health crisis, including an opioid crisis.

Lisa Kelso was selected to lead the new MCIT team based on her extensive experience in the field of behavioral health within our community. She worked for more than 20 years for Clark County Department of Juvenile Justice Services addressing the behavioral health needs of youth receiving intervention from the Department and Clark County courts. During her tenure, Lisa participated in numerous multidisciplinary teams and fostered positive relationships with community stakeholders and service providers; these relationships will be invaluable in meeting the objectives of the task force.

I believe Lisa Kelso will be a great addition to the Regional Opioid Task Force and strongly urge you to appoint her as a member of this important panel.
