1. What kind of experience do you have with public administration?

My law enforcement background includes a broad range of responsibilities from implementation of controls for the various public administrative projects from helping conduct a pedestrian study along the Las Vegas Strip to collecting data for the sole purposes of developing code for pedestrian bridges in becoming legal crosswalks. Much of my experience was working directly with my chain of command and Clark County Commissioners and their liaisons.

Investigate citizen complaints, respond to requests and inquiries related to zoning, building, solid waste, sign enforcement, graffiti and other issues regarding the enforcement of County Codes. Investigate construction related code enforcement violations to include field investigations, documentation of case facts, interaction with citizens, businesses, community leaders, and potential criminal and civil court proceeding participation. Participated in CMART meetings and site assessments.

2. Describe your interest in serving as a Hearing Officer. Include information not already mentioned about yourself, your experience, and background that supports your interest.

As for my emergency management experience I have been able to collaboratively work with city, county, and public and private entities on several projects. My direct instructor experience extends to teaching city and county staff on ICS 300/400 level that help protect our critical infrastructure sectors. The importance of FEMA-Federal Emergency Management Systems utilizing ICS-Incident Command System structure helps to provide layered protocols, procedures and actions which utilize MOU-memorandums of understanding, COOP-continuum of operations agreements with local and state partners in the event of a disaster. Air quality in southern Nevada is paramount in the safety and well being of the 2.3 million plus residents and the 40.8 plus million visitors in 2023. My personal and professional experiences of being raised and worked in law enforcement within a small community on the gulf of Florida has given me knowledge on air quality. Our community continues to experience various air quality issues such as red tide, Saharan dust warnings, and year-round pollen counts that impact vulnerable parts of their population. These are all points of how air quality effects public safety and health and my experiences within these environments. I believe that my dynamic law enforcement and emergency management experience will be an asset in this position.

3. A Hearing Officer appointed under this section should have a working knowledge of air quality issues, arbitration, law and/or engineering. What specific education or experience do you have in these areas?

In southern Nevada we are unique in the fact that we have a multitude of air quality monitoring concerns such as natural occurring particulate, low humidity levels, plant pollen, wildfires, emissions from various fuel sources, and excavation of soil through various means. Air quality monitoring is prudent in maintaining our diverse and over 8000 square mile complex ecosystems in Clark County. My emergency management experience adds to the mapping portion of this position as I am versed and trained in ArcGIS Online Mapping Software. As for arbitration and engineering my skill set consists of working knowledge of arbitration processes through working directly with Clark County Commissioners on various public safety projects within District F, E, and C. My extensive experience with presenting/lecturing to include emergency management, risk management, crime prevention through community engagement, and wayfinding design. I have presentation experience involving community groups, public and private organizations, executive staff briefings, and for legislative/judicial hearings. Additionally, conducted field environmental security and safety site risk assessments within residential, commercial, retail, scholastic, medical, and hospitality settings. Provided risk assessments including comprehensive reviews through a written-photographic report of environmental aspects with specific threat analysis as a critical infrastructure objective. All assessments included aspects of criminal, civil attributes, and administrative risk management investigations utilizing the principles of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles. Further project management experience includes completing site risk assessments, analyzed data, developed protocols to help reduce criminal activity through applying proactive methods within a given environment.
