Members serve four-year (4-year) terms and may not serve more than two (2) consecutive terms. Members must reside in the City of Henderson.

**Summary:** As the elected Vice-Chair/Chair-Elect/Past-Chair of the College Library Section of the Association of College and Research Libraries, I have overseen approximately 2,600 members in North America's leading professional organization for baccalaureate-institution librarians.

The pandemic took a toll on the College Libraries Section. At the start of the 2023-2024 term as chair, the section faced a severe volunteer shortage, with only one of twelve committees having an appointed chair and none fully staffed. To ensure fully staffed committees for 2024-2025, I led an ad hoc committee that consolidated the section's activities into four core committees. I also developed a task timeline for each committee to ensure progress and monitor objectives throughout the 2024-2025 term.

### ***Chair, NSHE Chief Library Officers Group***

**Summary:** Led the NSHE Chief Library Officers in developing a presentation for the NSHE Board of Regent's Fiscal Sustainability Committee.

Mr. Joe Sunbury, former Chief Internal Auditor of NSHE, contacted former President Bart Patterson with a series of nine questions about the acquisition practices of NSHE Libraries. Given that this message was sent to all NSHE presidents, I reached out to Mr. Sunbury and the library dean/director at each NSHE institution to propose a collective approach to our response. Mr. Sunbury was most appreciative of this suggestion. He subsequently communicated that the expectation was for a joint NSHE Libraries presentation to the Board's Fiscal Sustainability Committee. I proceeded to coordinate the NSHE Libraries group and set the agendas for four May meetings. I then worked with BOR staff to convene a meeting with the Chair of the Committee, former Regent Patrick Carter, to share a draft of the presentation. I also worked with Maggie Farrell (UNLV) and Emily King (CSN) to draft the final presentation for the Committee's meeting.

### ***Member, Promotion and Tenure Task Force, 2019-2023***

**Summary:** Completed the Library's efforts to revise the Library's Evaluation Form, Annual Review Guidelines, and Promotion and Tenure Guidelines, a four-year long process, guided by evidence-based principles.

From 2019-2021, I led the Library's contributions to the campuswide Promotion and Tenure Task Force (a.k.a Standards of Academe Task Force). From 2020-2023, I led the Revision of Unit-

Level Tenure and Annual Review Guidelines in the Library. With respect to the unit-level documents, this process involved leading more than 20 work meetings related to the review. Our review began with an evidence-based assessment of high-impact performance management practices. We then progressed to a complete overhaul of the librarianship, scholarship, and service components of the evaluation.

#### **Summary of Duties:**

Craft and advance a compelling vision of the Library's program that is strategically aligned with the campus mission.

#### **Select accomplishments connected to my position description:**

##### **Provide Visionary Leadership for the Library**

- **Awarded the 2020 Excellence in Academic Libraries Award by the Association of College & Research Libraries (ACRL).** Nevada State is the first Hispanic-Serving Institution to receive this award in the Baccalaureate Category and only the second public institution recognized in the award's 21-year history. The Association of College and Research Libraries is the leading

professional organization for academic librarians. The award recognizes “academic librarians and staff who work together as a team to develop academic libraries that are outstanding in furthering the educational missions of their institutions”. Previous recipients include Amherst College, Carleton College, Grinnell College, Swarthmore College, and Wellesley College.

- **Received a commendation for mission fulfillment from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)** during the College’s 2020 Mission Fulfillment and Sustainability Evaluation. This commendation is the highest unit recognition given by the regional accrediting body.
- **Planned and led the opening of the Marydean Martin Library, the first all-digital academic library in the state of Nevada.** Worked closely with campus stakeholders on the planning and execution of a \$76 million (2025 dollars) building project. Recognized by ACRL as part of the Library’s “digital transformation”.
- **Awarded the inaugural 2023 Student-Focused Department of the Year Award by the Nevada State Student Alliance.** Student leaders recognized the Library for its outstanding service to students and impactful partnerships with student organizations, promoting student wellness and connecting them with academic resources and initiatives.
- **Achieved leading campus-wide student satisfaction ratings.** In the 2024 campus-wide student satisfaction survey, 97% of students selected “satisfied” or “very satisfied” as their library satisfaction rating.
- **Finalist for the 2023 Cashman Good Government Award for Academic Affairs’ textbook affordability initiatives.** The Nevada Taxpayer’s Association’s Good Government Award was established in 1997 to recognize superior stewardship of taxpayer dollars by government employees and/or agencies.

### **Integrate the Library into the Intellectual Life of the Institution**

- **Transitioned the library program from traditional “input and output” measures to a focus on equitable student outcomes.** Through data partnerships with Institutional Effectiveness, we have confirmed that there are no significant equity gaps in the use of library spaces, collections, and services based on race/ethnicity, gender, Pell-Grant status, and first-generation student status.
- **Enhanced the accessibility of course materials through the No-Cost Textbook Summer Institute.** Over 30% of full-time instructors at Nevada State, from every school, have participated in this faculty development program. This has resulted in approximately 70% of course sections being offered without required textbook costs.
- **Provided oversight for the campus-wide Common Read program.** Secured funding for faculty development workshops for Common Read assignment design and significantly increased campus engagement in Common Read activities.
- **Oversaw the development of the Library’s Usability Lab.** This unique academic library service offers usability testing for university interfaces, leading to measurable improvements in the accessibility of course content in the Learning Management System.

### **Advocate For and Promote the University Library**

- **Integrated information literacy into the core curriculum.** Achieved formal integration of information literacy learning outcomes into the core curriculum, marking the first major update to the core curriculum in 20 years.



- **Revamped the Library's Teaching and Learning Program through evidence-based practices, focusing on faculty development initiatives.** Instructors who developed research assignments via library programming saw a 24% average improvement in proficiency across the three learning outcomes: communication of evidence, attribution of sources, and evaluation of sources.
- **Partnered with Institutional Research on Data Collection and Reporting.** Developed a data submission workflow that empowers the library team to collect, visualize, and analyze library data via the institutional data warehouse.

#### **Leverage and Increase the Library's Resources**

- **Engaged in cooperative collecting with library deans and directors in the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE).** Annual savings are estimated at \$4 million across Southern Nevada institutions.
- **Secured and continue to provide ongoing stewardship for a major library gift in collaboration with the Division of Advancement.** At the time—one of the largest gifts in the institution's history.
- **Aligned librarian salaries with instructor salaries.** Successfully advocated for a 19% compensation increase for assistant professor library faculty, achieving parity with instructor salaries.

#### **Recruit, Hire, Evaluate and Develop Academic Faculty, Administrative Faculty, and Classified Staff**

- **Reimagined the library faculty evaluation and promotion process using evidence-based principles.** Incorporated peer evaluations and team-based projects into the evaluation protocol.
- **Developed intensive candidate recruitment practices. These practices** have resulted in full-time library faculty and staff demographics mirroring the racial demographics of the Las Vegas Valley (~40% minoritized), aligning with Nevada State's dominant geographic territory for incoming students.
- **Developed an inclusive organizational culture.** The most recent campus-wide climate survey reports that Library faculty reported the highest campus-wide mean levels of "fairness," "support," and "job-related attitudes" compared to all other academic faculty.
- **Implemented a library-wide project management framework.** This initiative developed leadership skills and fostered innovative team-based accomplishments. Campus climate surveys reported very positive scores for "supervisory support," "tasks and responsibilities," "teamwork," and "employee development."

#### **Support and Encourage Active Participation in External Partnerships and Initiatives**

- **Oversaw the launch of the University's first Dual Credit faculty development initiative.** The University Library collaborated with Dual Credit instructors to create or adapt assignments for the Fall 2024 – Spring 2025 academic year, connecting their students with University Library resources and aligning with information literacy best practices.
- **Leadership on the Ex Libris Primo VE migration.** Partnered with NSHE South institutions to transition from Ex Libris Primo Back Office to Ex Libris Primo VE (Library Discovery Service) significantly improving the efficiency and effectiveness of core library functions.

***Interim Director of Digital Learning Initiatives, Nevada State College (Nov. 2015–Nov. 2016)*****Summary of duties:**

In addition to the Director of Library Services duties, provided leadership for effective technology-enabled pedagogy, instructional technology, and successful implementation of instructional design initiatives across the curriculum.

**Major Accomplishments:**

- **Transitioned to a new user interface in the Canvas LMS:** Migrated 1,500 legacy and active courses into a new user interface. Provided student and faculty support for the interface enhancements.
- **Outcomes assessment software selection:** Collaborated on the evaluation and selection of campus-wide outcomes assessment software.
- **Developed a “New Student Online Pre-Orientation” for incoming first-year and transfer students:** In close collaboration with the Orientation Program, developed an online pre-orientation course that addresses academic requirements, institutional policies, financial aid, registration, and community building.

**Summary of Duties:**

- Performed collection development and resource acquisition for the social sciences research collections with an annual budget of approximately \$5 million (2022 dollars).
- Developed and delivered research services, information literacy instruction, and digital scholarship services to students and faculty in Public Policy, Global Studies, and Military Studies.
- Hired, trained, supervised, evaluated, and mentored Research & Instructional Services graduate student assistants.
- Managed staffing, budgeting, and service quality for UNC Libraries’ main research help desk.
- Provided technical assistance with website creation, image editing, scanning, and the Adobe Creative Suite software in the Undergraduate Library’s Design Lab.
- Managed collections in the areas of Public Policy, Public Administration, International Relations, Journalism, Law, and Military Studies.
- Developed tailored online learning objects to support access and delivery of the library collection and services.
- As a member of the cross-unit Library Assessment Team, cultivated a culture of assessment within UNC Libraries. Developed and applied assessment expertise to support library assessment projects.

**Major Accomplishments:**

- **Leadership of UNC Libraries’ discovery service implementation:** Led a thirteen-person multi-library team that conducted usability testing and technical evaluations of several discovery

configurations. This work produced recommendations that led to a new discovery layer adoption and results page configuration for the UNC Libraries' home page.

- **Initiated online portfolios as a library service:** Through my outreach efforts, I identified a faculty need for assistance in the online promotion of their work. I initiated contact with social sciences faculty and created customized, easy-to-update web portfolios that display their publications, teaching, and research collaborations.
- **Strategic plan leadership:** Initiated and led the Davis Research & Instructional Services (R&IS) department in the development of its first unit-based strategic plan.
- **Creation of a library-wide service assessment plan:** Led a cross-departmental team in the development of the service element in UNC Libraries' assessment plan. My team conducted a comprehensive internal and external scan and implemented the plan through the creation of library assessment priorities, the achievement of specific and measurable goals, the acquisition of new assessment tools, and enhanced staff training.
- **PLCY 210: Policy Innovation and Analysis assignment:** Collaborated closely with the course instructors to create scaffolded research assignments for the core class for public policy majors. This assignment utilized the strengths of UNC's public policy collection and closely integrated the learning outcomes of the course.
- **Assessing the needs of interdisciplinary researchers and instructors:** UNC's Academic Plan called on UNC Libraries to provide expertise for interdisciplinarity. To determine the appropriate form of this expertise, I conducted in-depth user interviews with interdisciplinary social sciences faculty and graduate students. The findings were used to support new resource allocations and user services.
