Public Hearing on the FY2025-2029 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Consolidated Plan and FY2025 Action Plan

Recommended Action:

Conduct a Public Hearing on the FY2025-2029 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Consolidated Plan, FY2025 Action Plan for Housing and Community Development.

Summary:

The Consolidated Plan is a requirement to obtain HUD grant funding amounting to approximately \$66,157,605 million over the next five years.

The Consolidated Plan is required every five years by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for jurisdictions that receive a direct allocation of HUD formula funds from the HUD Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD). CPD formula funds received by the HUD Consolidated Plan (HCP) Consortium include the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership Act (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG).

The purpose of the FY 2025-2029 HUD Consolidated Plan is to provide current information on housing and community development needs at the local level, along with an estimate of housing needs and related issues, and an identification of housing and community development policies to address existing and future challenges. An annual Action Plan is then required to outline specific projects that will be undertaken each year of the five-year period.

The Consolidated Plan determines priorities, establishes strategic goals, and allocates resources for the HUD CPD programs administered by Clark County for the 5-year period beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2030.

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The 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan addresses the activities of both the Clark County CDBG Urban County Program, which consists of Clark County, the City of Boulder City, and the City of Mesquite, and the Clark County HOME Consortium, which consists of Clark County and the City of North Las Vegas. Clark County serves as the collaborative applicant and these consortiums are referred to as the HUD Consolidated Plan (HCP) Consortium.

As part of the consolidated planning process, Clark County adhered to its Citizen Participation Plan. The County consulted with a wide variety of organizations, and citizens in to gain understanding of the housing and community development state. This Consolidated Plan represents a collective effort from a broad array of engagement opportunities. In addition to announcements in the local newspapers concerning the availability of federal housing and community development funds, Clark County held public hearings regarding the allocation of federal funds, utilized social media for public engagement, online surveys, and face-to-face interactions.

Further, for Clark County, the Citizen's Advisory Development Committee (CDAC) was involved in the review of CDBG, HOME and ESG applications; CDAC received presentations and materials from each applicant and made recommendations for funding. Their recommendations guide the County's funding decisions.

The Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Action Plan describes the funding allocations, by jurisdiction, for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), the HOME Investment Partnerships Grant (HOME), the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and the Nevada Account for Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AAHTF). Total Federal funding represented in the plan is \$13,231,521.

The funding levels shown in the draft Plan are estimated amounts. All proposed activities' budgets will be proportionally increased or decreased from the estimated funding levels to match actual allocation amounts.

It is expected that HUD will approve the FY2025-2029 HUD Consolidated Plan and FY2025 Action Plan by the end of July.
