Homelessness in Clark County




Point in Time Count 2024

Increase in unsheltered homelessness since 2023.






Increase in sheltered homelessness since 2023.

- Congregate & Non-Congregate Emergency Shelters



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


Clark County Non-Congregate Shelter Program Overview

- Objective: Provide non-congregate shelter with case management and supportive services for homeless individuals and families.
- Background: The NCS program utilizes vacant hotels to provide safe, temporary housing, reducing homelessness and offering wraparound services.
- 1 Navigation Center and 6 Non-Congregate
 Shelters *currently*



Homelessness

- Senior Rental Assistance: Available for applicants age 62+
- Welfare Set Aside Program: Mortgage, rent and relocation assistance.
- Eviction Prevention: \$18.4M in aid for 2,141 applications.
- Fixed Income Rental Assistance: \$4.6M for 1,103 fixed-income applicants.
- Eviction Diversion: Collaborative eviction prevention for seniors and disabled. (Las Vegas Justice Court, Legal Aid of Southern Nevada, and Clark County Social Service.)
- Step Up & Project Home: Monthly housing stipends to 320 transition aged youth (18-26)

Ownership

Clark County Detention Center Reentry Navigators

 Jail-based Community Navigators help individuals being released from the Clark County Detention Center with access the resources they need to thrive. This can include assistance with housing, transportation, medically assisted treatment and more.

Emergency Shelter & Bridge Housing

- Short-term housing that helps people find/establish permanent stable housing through support services during their stay.
- Congregate Shelter: Catholic Charities, The Shade Tree, Las Vegas Rescue Mission, Family Promise of Las Vegas, Salvation Army
- Non-Congregate Shelter (NCS): 1 Clark County Navigation Center, 9 Clark County NCS Facilities



Transitional & Rapid Rehousing

- Temporary time-limited supportive services coupled with temporary lodging leading to the achievement of obtaining and maintaining housing stability.
- Community wide transitional and rapid rehousing programs available through Coordinated Entry
 - Transitional Housing Available: 25
 Projects; 728 total beds
 - Rapid Rehousing Available: 40
 - **Projects**; 1,872 total beds



Permanent Supportive Housing

- Long- term housing with support services for people who have experienced homelessness for more than 12 months.
- Permanent Supportive Housing Available: 15
 Projects; 2,762 beds.
 - 1,531 of those beds are specifically SNRHA VASH vouchers for Veterans.
- \$30M in Community Housing Funds and other County funds have been invested into the construction of over 150 units.
- Funding includes housing development and supportive services.



Clark County Community Housing

- A dedicated team within Clark County created in 2022 with an initial investment of \$160M with a focus on:
 - Affordable Rental Housing
 - Permanent Supportive Housing
 - Homeownership
- Other programs:
 - Landlord Engagement & Property Services (LEAPS)
 - Landlord initiatives: Landlord Mitigation
 Fund & Sign-On Bonus





Community Housing Fund (CHF)

- Construction and Preservation of Permanent Affordable Housing
- 3,800 units funded since 2022
- Predominately 60% AMI
- 30% AMI units
- Access for Social Service Clients





- Homeownership for households between 50% AMI and 100% AMI
- First Time Homebuyers
- 240 Homes







Substance Addiction Treatment Center



- 96 Bed Facility
- 2 Buildings
- 41,976 Square Feet

- Services:
 - Crisis Stabilization
 - Medical Detoxification
 - Residential Treatment

- 36 Chairs
- Serving Individuals facing
 - Psychiatric Crisis
 - Severe Intoxication
 - Diversion from the ER and Jail
- Services:
 - Assessment
 - Stabilization
 - Housing Navigation
