**BACKGROUND:**

Since 1996, with the exception of FY2009 and FY2011, Clark County has been the recipient and administrative agent of funding received from the Bureau of Justice (BJA) for the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant and its successor, the Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). These funds have supported various local government agencies and nonprofit organizations in their efforts to undertake criminal prosecution of violent offenders, conduct peer mediation/conflict resolution in the public school system, reduce gang violence, and implement other programs aimed at reducing crime and promoting public safety.

On September 1, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved the submission of project recommendations based on a public hearing for the Local Law Enforcement Advisory Committee (LLEAC) that included selected projects for inclusion in the application for the FY 2020-2021 Justice Assistance Grant 2020-DJ-BX-0483 by Clark County Social Service on behalf of the County, as fiscal agent, and City of Las Vegas, in the amount of \$782,430 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, and authorized the County Manager or designee to execute any necessary agreements and accept all grant funds awarded.

On May 16, 2023, the Board of Commissioners approved the reallocation of funds originally awarded to the Clark County District Attorney's Office to four agencies, including the City of Las Vegas-West Las Vegas Arts Center. Because the agency was not an original awardee of the JAG 2020-DJ-BX-0483 grant cycle, \$3,660 must be reallocated to another agency that was an original awardee. This agenda item approves the recommendation to reallocate \$3,660 to awardee Project REAL.

On September 1, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved the submission of project recommendations based on a public hearing for the Local Law Enforcement Advisory Committee (LLEAC) that included selected projects for inclusion in the application for the FY 2020-2021 Justice Assistance Grant 2020-DJ-BX-0483 by Clark County Social Service on behalf of the County, as fiscal agent, and City of Las Vegas, in the amount of \$782,430 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, and authorized the County Manager or designee to execute any necessary agreements and accept all grant funds awarded.

The CCDA's Office has advised that they will not be utilizing the allocation of \$24,395.38; therefore, it is recommended that the funds be reallocated to Vision Theatrical Foundation \$9,755.38; Clark County Law Foundation \$7,320.00; City of Las Vegas-West Las Vegas Arts Center \$3,660.00; and Community Counseling Center \$3,660.00. Approval of this reallocation totals \$24,395.38.

**BACKGROUND:**

Background: Clark County Social Service (CCSS) requests that the Board of County Commissioners ratify the submission of the grant application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) funding under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Formula Program to support local initiatives addressing crime through the provision of services directly to individuals and/or communities and by improving the effectiveness and efficiency of the criminal justice systems, process and procedures and authorize the County Manager or her designee to execute any necessary agreement.

July 9, 2020, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) announced the availability of \$782,430 in FY-2020 JAG funding under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG).

On August 13, 2020, the Local Law Enforcement Advisory Committee (LLEAC) reviewed project proposals, heard applicant presentations, and made project funding recommendations. The LLEAC recommendations include approval of City of Las Vegas JAG projects in the amount of \$112,404 and Clark County JAG projects (including nonprofit sub-recipients) in the amount of \$670,026. The specific project recommendations are included as Attachment A.

A multi-year Interlocal Agreement executed on April 21, 2019, between the County and City acknowledges Clark County as the fiscal agent and lead agency for the JAG grants for the period of FY-2018/2019 and will submit the BJA application on behalf of the County and City.
