


Clark County Non-Congregate Shelter Continuum




Navigation Center Outcomes

UMC/Clark County Crisis Stabilization

- Clark County, in partnership with UMC and the State will open Southern Nevada's first crisis stabilization center.
- 17,066 square feet; 24 inpatient bed converting to 30 outpatient chairs.
- Intended to serve patients facing
 - Psychiatric crisis
 - Severe intoxication/needing to detox
 - Diversion from the ER
- Services include assessment, stabilization and housing navigation as needed.
