I am interested in serving on the Citizens Advisory Committee as a representative from the Clark County School District because of the connections I have with social-emotional learning and mental health support. I have seen the impact when social workers and mental health services are used in conjunction with technology to address student mental health. I have worked with school social workers to utilize evidence-based and nationally recognized instructional practices to interface with the educational process and meet the needs of schools, students, and families in the Clark County School District.

The structures I have implemented focus on a strengths-based and system-wide approach. School social workers focus on prevention and interventions by facilitating engagement between schools, families, and the community. Using their training in systems theory, advocacy, cultural competence, and the Code of Ethics set by the National Association of Social Workers, school social workers address the District's Strategic Imperatives by providing direct services to students and families using SEL concepts and best practices. My professional development sessions help school social workers to link children, youth, and families to community agency resources, providing Response to Instruction (RTI) Intervention on all three (3) tiers and aligning services to meet the educational needs of all students.

My department is responsible for addressing the mental health crisis that Southern Nevada is currently experiencing. I have been successful with recruiting social workers for school site positions. Most of these schools are struggling with budget cuts. Once at schools, school social workers work with Lifeline (Mental Health Resources) to protect, fortify, and strengthen students' social and emotional well-being by identifying and seeing them in person, assessing their needs, and tailoring tiered interventions, responsively and proactively. School social workers believe that for all students to succeed, they must be safe and feel a sense of belonging. Working with Lifeline commits social workers to this outcome for all students by continuing to build and strengthen social-emotional skills.

I can use my experience and expertise to develop mental health guidelines that will help school districts and communities implement procedures to help all students. My experience with communicating with mental health companies to deploy resources to schools throughout the district has led to an increase in mental health referrals and a decrease in expulsions. As a result, my work would include, identifying problems in a child's living situation (home, school, and community) that may affect the child's adjustment, ability, and attendance in the educational setting, conducting home visits, and meeting with families regularly, developing and facilitating weekly support groups which provide students with strategies to cope with and overcome difficulties impacting school performance.
