- Support ancillary programming around public art installations;

- Recruit new committee members and partners;
- Promote major public art achievements/events;
- Learn, laugh and grow with us as we support Clark County's Public Art Program!

It should be noted that as an individual on the Art Committee you will be ineligible to apply for any funding from the County Arts Plan.
