Development funded by SNPLMA and NDOW to provide multiple venues of firearms and archery training to citizens and visitors of southern Nevada. The 2880 acres of property required an act of congress to transfer title to Clark County to be used specifically as a public shooting and archery facility.

Timeline: 2000- City of Las Vegas appoints citizen action team to begin planning. Clark County Commissioners directs county officials to review development
 2001- Environment studies completed and City of Las Vegas, N. Las Vegas, Henderson and Nevada Legislature pass resolutions of support
 2002- BCC appoint a 30-member Citizens Advisory Committee
 2003- Conveyance of property from Fed government to Clark County.
 2007- Construction begins following public hearings.
 2009- Open for public shooting December 19, 2009

The archery 3D trails are primitive and in need of improvement to allow those with disabilities and confined to wheelchairs an opportunity to enjoy the outdoor experience of archery in a natural setting. The north loop is almost level but in need of filling in washes that intersect with the circular trail in multiple locations. These areas should have culverts installed and leveled. The multiple shooting lanes need modification to allow chair-bound archers the ability to retrieve their arrows and move easily from shooting station to shooting station.
