RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Clark County Fire Department is currently the sponsoring agency of Nevada Task Force 1 (NVTF-1); and

WHEREAS, the NVTF-1 is deployed to emergency events as requested by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); and

WHEREAS, the Clark County Fire Department is experiencing a critical shortage of trained personnel with qualifications in emergency response and management available to work parttime, who are needed to respond to FEMA deployments; and

WHEREAS, reemployment of retirees in the part-time position of FEMA USAR/IMT Assistant would provide an immediate resource of trained personnel to respond to FEMA deployments; and

WHEREAS, NRS 286.523 provides that the governing body of an employer which desires to employ a retired public employee to fill a position for which there is a critical labor shortage must make certain determinations and findings regarding the need for such reemployment so that the retirement benefits of such personnel are not jeopardized;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board finds and resolves as follows:

- 1. Clark County Fire Department is experiencing a critical labor shortage of trained personnel with qualifications in emergency management available to work part-time, who are needed to respond to FEMA deployments.
- 2. Training for this position is extensive and complicated, and there is insufficient time to recruit and train new personnel for this position to meet the existing demand.
- 3. Neighboring entities are facing similar challenges and are not able to fill these essential areas.
- 4. The effective date of the critical need designations for the part-time position of FEMA USAR/IMT Assistant is not expected to last more than two years.
