

- Raises tax revenue.




DEFENDING CHILDREN

UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN RELEASED TO FAMILIES IN NEVADA/CLARK COUNTY


93 CALLS ASKING FOR REPRESENTATION FOR CHILDREN IN 2023

IMMIGRATION DETENTION

DEPORTATION PROCEEDINGS GENERALLY

8567 new removal cases filed in Nevada in FY2023

85 percent have no lawyer

692 new removal cases filed in Nevada for people in detention.




321 CALLS FROM DETENTION SEEKING LEGAL HELP IN 2023

SUMMARY: JAN 2022-NOV 4, 2023

- 343 Clients Represented
 - 134 Unaccompanied Children
 - 81 Detained Adults
 - 128 University Legal Services
- 86 Cases from pre-2022 Still Open
- 25 People protected through Asylum or Convention against Torture
- 13 Cancellation or dismissed removal
- 31 Bond
- 10 Naturalization
- 48 Lawful Permanent Residents (adjustment of status)



FUNDING - HISTORY

- AB376 in 2021: \$500,000 over two years
- Clark County in 2021: \$500,000 for two years
- Partnership with Immigrant Justice Corps



STAFFING AND FUNDING

- 7 Attorney Staff Positions as of October
- 1.5 Nonlawyer staff
- FY2024 Funding: \$1.1 million costs
 - Office space donated
 - 74 percent of funds go to personnel



UNSPENT FUNDS

During the start-up period of the office, we did not spend most of the County appropriation as we gradually hired staff.

Current request: Extend the time period for the unspent funds (\$369,341)

LOOKING FORWARD

Costs Rising

- Need to add nonlawyer staff (current 7:2 ratio)
- Expand office space
- NSHE COLA

Changing & Unmet Needs

- 652 calls in non-service areas
- Federal instability can change the nature of cases in Southern Nevada
