Liquor Delivery

Overview

- Pursuant with NRS 369.489, on 12/05/2022, the Nevada Tax Commission approved regulation LCB File No. R068-21 allowing for the delivery of liquor from licensed retail liquor stores
- These regulations apply to retail liquor stores, which are defined as "an establishment where beers, wines and liquors" are sold to a consumer.
- The establishment must sell all three types: beer, wine <u>and</u> liquor.
- This excludes convenience stores and brewpubs as they do not sell all three required types of retail products.

Requirements

- These regulations require the County to adopt an ordinance allowing for liquor delivery by 3rd parties, such as a delivery support service. The liquor must be in its original unopened container.
- The delivery must occur in a jurisdiction in which the retail liquor store is licensed to sell liquor at retail.
- There is not a limitation on the amount of liquor that can be delivered or a limitation on the number of deliveries to a specific address or consumer per day.



Requirements

- State law requires any delivery of liquor to be made to a person who
 is 21 years of age or older at the address specified on the order as
 the delivery address and prohibits the delivery of liquor to a person
 who shows signs of intoxication.
 - a. The person making the delivery cannot complete the delivery until shown an acceptable form of identification showing that the person accepting the delivery is 21 years of age or older.
 - b. Acceptable forms of identification are a valid driver's license, permanent resident card, tribal identification card or any other written or documentary evidence issued by a governmental entity indicating that the person is 21 years of age or older.
- The delivery must originate during the posted hours of the retail liquor store



Requirements

- The regulation requires a person who makes deliveries on behalf of a retail liquor store or delivery support service to maintain a delivery log which contains certain information for each delivery of liquor made. These records are required to be maintained for 4 years and must include:
 - a. The name of the purchaser;
 - b. The name and date of birth of the person who accepts delivery as shown on their form of identification;
 - c. The street address of the delivery location;
 - d. The time and date of the purchase and delivery; and
 - e. The signature or other verification of the identity of the person who accepts the delivery.
