NOTIFICATION OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CLARK COUNTY CODE TITLE 9, CHAPTER 9.04 SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Dear Licensee and Community Partners:

Please be notified pursuant to NRS 237.080, of proposed amendments to Clark County Code, Title 9, Chapter 9.04, for Solid Waste Management. The amendments are available for your review online at www.clarkcountynv.gov/businesslicense.

Specifically, the proposed amendments will amend certain sections of Chapter 9.04 for Solid Waste Management. The proposed amendments address the following key areas:

- **Section 9.04.010** revises and adds certain definitions.
- **Subsection 9.04.010.320** defines overflow of solid waste by non-residential customers and residential customers with a residential small container when the solid waste container cannot be closed by less than 12 inches.
- **Subsection 9.04.117(a)** allows residential small containers (1, 2 or 3 cubic yards) in certain circumstances.
- **Subsection 9.04.117(c)** allows a residential customer to request a second weekly collection day for a residential small container for an additional charge.
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- **Section 9.04.119** allows the franchisee to replace recycling containers for solid waste containers in certain circumstances when contamination of recyclable materials exceeds a certain level.
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- **Section 9.04.170** requires the property owner of a single-family residence to be responsible for all charges for the collection of solid waste and recyclables and be the named party on the solid waste account.
- **Several sections** update the rates for collection services, late fees, lien fees and other charges to the current rates as of July 1, 2021.
- **Table 9.04.170B** establishes a solid waste collection fee for short term residential rentals once they become licensed with the County.

- **Section 9.04.190** provides for an overflow charge for residential customers with a home occupation in certain circumstances.
- **Section 9.04.225** allows the franchisee to set rates/prices on certain goods, services and other functions not covered by franchise agreement.
- **Section 9.04.240** provides that it shall be mandatory for any person owning, occupying or managing any premises to subscribe to solid waste collection services in order to discourage the illegal handling and disposal of solid waste.
- **Section 9.04.245** allows the franchisee to directly pass through to its customers certain fees and taxes imposed by governmental entities, excluding franchise fees.
- **Section 9.04.255** allows the franchisee to charge certain fees for collection costs.
- **Section 9.04.260** changes the annual rate increases based on Consumer Price Index (CPI) from the general CPI to an index that is based on water and sewer and trash collection services, which is more applicable to the services provided.
- **Section 9.04.270** clarifies and enhances certain customer service and repair standards.
- **Section 9.04.280** clarifies and enhances certain telephone answering standards.
- **Section 9.04.370** allows for the franchisee to withhold solid waste collection services for nonpayment of charges by commercial or industrial customers under certain circumstances.

In accordance with NRS 237.080, business owners and interested parties may submit data and arguments to the Clark County Board of Commissioners, in care of the Department of Business License as to whether the proposed amendment will:

1. Impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a business; or
2. Directly restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a business.

Gestión de Residuos Sólidos.
Las enmiendas están
disponibles para su revisión

Específicamente, las
enmiendas propuestas
modificarán algunas
secciones del capítulo 9.04
para la gestión de residuos
sólidos. Las enmiendas
propuestas abordan las
siguientes áreas claves:

- La sección 9.04.010 revisa y
agrega ciertas definiciones.
- La subsección 9.04.010.320
define el desbordamiento de
desechos sólidos por clientes
no residenciales y clientes
residenciales con un
contenedor pequeño
residencial cuando el
contenedor de desechos
sólidos no puede ser cerrado
por menos de 12 pulgadas.
- Subsección 9.04.117(a)
permite contenedores
residenciales pequeños (1, 2 o
3 yardas cúbicas) en ciertas
circunstancias.
- La subsección 9.04.117(c)
permite que un cliente
residencial solicite un
segundo día de recolección
semanal para un contenedor
residencial pequeño por un
cobro adicional.
- La subsección 9.04.117(e)
propone un cobro adicional si
el contenedor residencial

pequeño se desborda
constantemente.

- La sección 9.04.119 permite
al franquiciado reemplazar
los contenedores de reciclaje
por contenedores de
desechos sólidos en ciertas
circunstancias cuando la
contaminación de los
materiales reciclables excede
cierto nivel.
- La sección 9.04.145 provee
para la recolección de
artículos voluminosos en
complejos multifamiliares.
- La sección 9.04.165 establece
requerimientos mínimos de
contenedores y niveles de
servicio para ciertos clientes.
- La sección 9.04.170 requiere
que el dueño de la propiedad
sea responsable por todos los
cobros de la colección de
desechos sólidos y
reciclables y sea la parte
nombrada en la cuenta de
desechos sólidos.
- Varias secciones actualizan
las tarifas de los servicios de
recolección, los cobros por
retrasos, los cobros por
gravamen y otros cobros a las
tarifas actuales a partir del 1
de julio de 2021.
- La tabla 9.04.170B establece
una tarifa de recolección de
desechos sólidos para los
alquileres residenciales de
corto plazo una vez que
obtienen la licencia del
condado.
- La sección 9.04.190 provee un
cobro por exceso de consumo
para los clientes
residenciales con una
ocupación doméstica en
determinadas circunstancias.
- La sección 9.04.225 permite
al franquiciado establecer
tarifas/precios sobre ciertos
bienes, servicios y otras
funciones no cubiertas por el
acuerdo de franquicia.
- La sección 9.04.240 establece
que será obligatorio para
toda persona que posea,
ocupe o administre cualquier
local, suscribirse a los
servicios de recolección de
desechos sólidos a fin de
disgustar el manejo y la
eliminación ilegal de los
mismos.
- La sección 9.04.245 permite
al franquiciado trasladar
directamente a sus clientes
ciertas tasas e impuestos
impuestos por entidades
gubernamentales, excluyendo
las tasas de franquicia.
- La sección 9.04.255 permite
al franquiciado cobrar
determinadas tasas por los
costos de recolección.
- La sección 9.04.260 cambia
los aumentos de tarifas
anuales basados en el índice
de Precios al Consumidor
(IPC), pasando del IPC general
a un índice basado en los
servicios de agua y
alcantarillado y de recogida
de basura, que es más
aplicable a los servicios
prestados.
- La sección 9.04.270 aclara y
mejora ciertas normas de
servicio al cliente y de
reparación.
- La sección 9.04.280 aclara y

mejora ciertas normas de
respuesta telefónica.

- La sección 9.04.370 permite
al concesionario retener los
servicios de recogida de
residuos sólidos por falta de
pago de los clientes
comerciales o industriales en
determinadas circunstancias.

克拉克县法规拟议修订通知

第 9 篇, 第 9.04 章

固体废物管理

尊敬的执照持有者和社区合作伙伴：

请根据 NRS 237.080 通知克拉克县法规第 9 篇第 9.04 章固体废物管理的拟议修正案。您可以访问 www.clarkcountynv.gov/depts/businesslicense 在线查看这些修订。

具体而言, 拟议的修订案将修订第 9.04 章中有关固体废物管理的某些部分。拟议的修订案涉及以下关键领域：

- 第 9.04.010 节修订并添加了某些定义。
- 第 9.04.010.320 小节, 有关固体废物超载的定义, 定义为当非住宅客户和使用住宅小容器的住宅客户固体废物容器不能关闭小于 12 英寸时。
- 第 9.04.117(a) 在某些情况下允许住宅小集装箱 (1、2 或 3 立方码)。
- 第 9.04.117(c) 允许住宅客户申请第二个每周收集日以收取住宅小容器的额外费用。
- 第 9.04.117(e) 如果住宅小容器持续超载, 将收取额外费用。
- 第 9.04.119 允许特许经营商在可回收材料的污染超过一定水平时, 在某些情况下更换用于固体废物回收的收容器。
- 第 9.04.145 在 multi-unit 住宅区随叫随到回收大件物品。
- 第 9.04.165 节规定了某些客户的最低容器和服务水平要求。
- 第 9.04.170 节要求单户住宅的业主负责收集固体废物和可回收物的所有费用, 并成为固体废物帐户的指定方。
- 多个部分将催收服务费、滞纳金、留置费和其他费用的费率更新为截至 2021 年 7 月 1 日的现行费率。
- 表 9.04.170B 规定了短期住宅租赁在获得县许可后, 设立固体废物收集费帐户。
- 第 9.04.190 节规定了在某些情况下对住宅的住客户收取的超额费用。
- 第 9.04.225 节允许特许经营者为特许经营协议未涵盖的某些商品、服务和其他功能设定费率/价格。

- 第 9.04.240 节规定，任何拥有、占用或管理任何场所的人都必须订购固体废物收集服务，以阻止非法处理和处置固体废物。
- 第 9.04.245 节允许加盟商直接将政府实体征收的某些费用和税款转嫁给其客户，不包括特许经营费。
- 第 9.04.255 节允许加盟商收取一定的收款费用。
- 第 9.04.260 节将基于消费者价格指数 (CPI) 的年增长率从一般 CPI 更改为基于供水、下水道和垃圾收集服务的指数，这更适用于所提供的服务。
- 第 9.04.270 节阐明并提高了某些客户服务和维修标准。
- 第 9.04.280 节阐明并增强了某些电话应答标准。
- 第 9.04.370 节允许特许经营商在某些情况下因商业或工业客户不支付费用而停止提供固体废物收集服务。

根据 NRS 237.080，企业主和相关方可以向克拉克县委员会提交数据和论据，由营业执照部负责，以确定拟议的修正案是否会：

1. 对企业造成直接且重大的经济负担；或
2. 直接限制企业的设立、经营或扩大。
