Judicial Enforcement Supervisor

- Reported directly to the Las Vegas Municipal Court, Criminal Division Chief Marshal, had direct responsibility for the development and implementation of an in-house Judicial Enforcement Unit (NRS 176.064) for the Las Vegas Municipal Court and Warrant Service Program.
- Project Manager for collection service agreements on delinquent misdemeanor traffic cases to be serviced by a vendor Collection Agency for First Party Receivables Management and Third-Party Debt Collection. This process resulted in additional case resolution and \$2.5 million annually.
- Nominated by the Las Vegas Municipal Court, appointed by the Nevada State Supreme Court, and elected Chairman of the Administrative Office of the Courts, Nevada Judicial Collection Task Force 2000-2001. Established by State Senate Concurrent Resolution 10 to review and make recommendations for Minimum Accounting Standards for Courts and Best Practices for enforcement of judicially ordered monetary sanctions in Nevada courts and currently used in Nevada courts today.
- Member of the Municipal Court Leadership Team. Worked with the Administrative Office of the Courts Nevada State Supreme Court, Las Vegas City Attorney, Clark County District Attorney, and the Nevada League of Cities and Counties, to provide subject matter expertise and testimony on Standards for Collections in Nevada courts to the Nevada Assembly Judiciary Subcommittee on the collection of fines, administrative assessment fees, fees, and restitution in 1999 and 2001.
- Wrote and recommended amended legislation for the 1999 State Legislative session to improve and expand the ability of Nevada courts, cities, and counties to enforce monetary sanctions and improve case resolution on Failure to Appear cases.
- Developed and implemented written Policy and Procedures for Fine and Fee Enforcement Training Programs, to improve enforcement of court ordered monetary sanctions.
- Developed policy and assisted in the implementation of the Municipal Court Judicial Enforcement Team (JET) initiating a grant funded program through the U.S. Department of Justice to enforce collection of monetary sanctions owed by defendants.
- Implemented the use of on-line credit bureau reports, Internet based vendor data bases and other skip tracing resources, to enhance the enforcement of monetary court ordered sanctions and improve the collection of judicially ordered fines and fees.

- Developed and implemented the Parking Collection Enhancement Program for the collection of delinquent civil Parking Infraction cases, collecting over \$1.3 million annually, increasing parking installment payments by 135%, and overall parking revenues by 35% from 1991-1995.
