Approve the Seventh Amendment to the 2020 Annual Action Plan to reprogram Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds, in the amount of \$1,116,507.11, from Administration, Homeless Services, and Mesquite Public Facilities, to Public Services; approve and authorize the award of \$1,116,507.11 in CDBG-CV funds to Nevada Senior Services to support the following activities: care facility discharge support, community education, outreach, vaccine clinics, and the COVID and Vulnerable Seniors Database and Communication System; authorize the Community Housing Administrator, or her designee, to submit the amendment to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and approve and authorize the County Manager, or his designee, to sign any necessary documents related thereto. The purpose of the Seventh Amendment to the FY 2020 Action Plan for Housing and Community Development is to reprogram \$1,116,507.11 of deobligated CDBG-CV funds from the following activities: \$73,633.51 from Administration, \$1,032,816.35 in Public Services, and \$10,057.25 from Mesquite Public Facilities, reallocating these funds to Public Services activities that support seniors.

The proposed use for the reprogrammed funds in the amount of \$1,116,507.11 is to award to Nevada Senior Services to expand the Hospital2Home care transition program, conduct community-wide education and outreach activities including vaccine clinics, and implement the core outreach tool to bridge the digital divide providing connectivity, communication, and resource access to isolated vulnerable individuals.
