The Clark County Fire Department (CCFD) is the largest and busiest fire department in the State of Nevada. CCFD is a combination fire department having both paid career and volunteer personnel. In 2023, CCFD responded to 146,626 calls for service with EMS calls accounting for 114, 011 of those calls.

The CCFD is managed by a Command Staff comprised of a Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chiefs who supervise divisions within the department, including Operations/Training, Emergency Medical Services, Emergency Management, Administration and Finance, Logistics, and Homeland Security, as well as Assistant Fire Chiefs who work under a Deputy Fire Chief to manage the larger divisions, including the Rural, Arson, and the Emergency Medical Services Divisions. The department's day to day operations are managed by 16 Battalion Chiefs working a three platoon schedule in five battalions and one Battalion Chief assigned to the Training Division.

Clark County is comprised of approximately 8,012 square miles, but only about 500 square miles make up the heavily populated Las Vegas Valley and this area of the county is protected by 30 Clark County Fire Department career fire stations. The remaining 7,500 square miles of the county are serviced by the Rural Division and the 10 rural/volunteer stations. The ten volunteer stations include Bunkerville, Searchlight, Goodsprings, Mountain Springs, Blue Diamond, Cold Creek, Trout Canyon, Indian Springs, Sandy Valley and Cal-Nev-Ari. These stations serve permanent residents ranging from 100 to almost 3,000 in population. The geographic make up of these rural areas range from mountainous topography, where forest and wildfires are a constant danger, to wide spanning desert areas that are desolate and challenging to traverse. The volunteer members provide EMS and Fire Rescue Services to most parts of the unincorporated areas of Clark County.

The requested equipment will benefit the towns of Indian Springs, Cold Creek, Creech Air Force Base, Sandy Valley, and Goodsprings. It will assist in the response along the I-95 Corridor by improving our capacity to provide lifesaving cardiac care to members of the public and the members of the fire department. The funds would be used to purchase two Lucas Chest Compression Systems with necessary accessories to maintain the usability 24 hours a day 7 days a week. All volunteer firefighters are required to maintain a CPR certification although many of our members hold advanced certifications beyond that scope to include paramedic certifications.

Statistically, nearly 80% of CCFD calls are of the EMS variety in which life saving care is provided to stabilize and/or treat patients. Volunteer firefighters generally arrive on scene of EMS calls with an anticipated down time of more than 20-30 minutes until a private ambulance arrives with transport capabilities. Furthermore, the areas identified for the grant (Indian Springs, Sandy Valley, etc.) have a minimum 30-minute transport time to the closest hospital. Minimal staffing along with expanded durational service times create difficulty managing life saving skills with traditional manual methods.

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) is inherently vital to increasing survival rates among those suffering a catastrophic cardiac event. Manual chest compressions isolate one member of the EMS responders to one specific skill. Maintaining adequate chest compressions along with allowing an EMS provider the ability to continue other life saving measures is the goal for obtaining the Lucas Chest Compression System. The Clark County Fire Department Volunteer/Rural division would greatly benefit by acquiring the devices.
