## 2024 Highlights

## Record-Breaking Year

- **58.4 million passengers** in 2024 (Our 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive record year)
- Previous annual record: 57.6 million passengers in 2023
- International air travel surged to 13.6% compared to 2023
- New and additional routes connecting LAS to Dublin, London, Manchester, Seoul, Ottawa, Montreal, & Tijuana
- FAA reported 612,457 total operations (takeoffs and landings) in 2024
   Ranking that the 4<sup>th</sup> most operations since 1989
- October was the second-busiest month on record with 5.4 million passengers
- Las Vegas was the 5<sup>th</sup> busiest TSA Checkpoint in the nation in October
- Super Bowl, Formula 1, & other World-Class Events brought millions to Las Vegas!


## Trending Slowdown

- **Gaming** in Nevada was down 1.75% in March (the Strip reported 4.78% reduction)
- Visitor volume was down 7.8%
- Retail sales tax was down 8.8%
- Air travelers were down 3.9% in March (the decline continued in April and was down 3.4%)
  - Canadian carriers reported down 20.2% nationally in visits to the US (14.9% down in March for Las Vegas)
  - Mexican carriers reported down 8% nationally (6.2% in Las Vegas)
  - Overseas visits reported down 3.8% nationally
- April 2025 has reported another decline in Consumer Confidence, making it the 5th consecutive month of decline

### Passenger Volume 2018 to 2024 with 2025 Estimated




#### Total Passengers 2018-2024 (w/ Estimated 2025)




## Rate-Based Revenues & Expenses FY2026 Budget




#### **REVENUES FY2025 BUDGET**




#### **REVENUES FY2026 BUDGET**



#### **EXPENSES FY2025 BUDGET**




