Yes, this project will aid our rural community in response to a terrorist attack in resulting in mass casualties. Our jurisdiction has four schools and host annually Clark County Fair which has 85,000 attendees over a 4 day period which is a possible location for a terrorist attack.

Our rural community first responders need to practice and drill our techniques with the equipment provided in this project to quickly triage patient to preserve life.

The project outcome is to be able to provide initial lifesaving equipment, triage, and treatment of victims from any act of terrorism in the rural area of Clark County and surrounding areas until additional help can arrive from surrounding areas. Our main objective is to arrive on scene with equipment to be able to hand out trauma kits to victims of terrorism, triage and begin to treat victims based on triage criteria until help can arrive from outlining urban areas.
