**BACKGROUND:**

The Ready, Set, Go! (RSG) Program is managed by the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC), which has a cooperative agreement for funding with the U.S. Forest Service. The IAFC has been accepting proposals for Wildfire Fuels Reduction Grants, which are used to support sustainable and cost-effective wildfire fuels reduction programs or projects.

Clark County Fire Department Rural Division submitted a grant application to RSG. The project will involve fuel reduction in and around Mountain Springs, Nevada. It will focus on maintaining roadways and access to properties, and tie into previously established and maintained fuel breaks along Potosi Canyon Road to mitigate wildfire risk along the anticipated path of fire travel toward the town.

Due to the timeframe between the grant announcement and submission due date, the grant application was submitted to RSG on July 28, 2022, prior to Board approval.

Staff recommends the Board ratify the submission of the attached grant application and accept funds awarded.
