Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC)

Recommended Action:

Approve and authorize the Chair to appoint 26 members (including 12 Representatives, 13 At-Large members and an alternate, and 1 appointee from participating cities) to the Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC) from the list of the following nominees: Representing 12 Town Advisory Boards (TAB) and Citizen Advisory Councils (CAC) Representatives Peter Sarles, Colleen Hicks, Kathy Ochs, Tanya Harrah, Misty Haji-Sheikh, Katlyn Cunningham, Christine Brown, Michele Brown, Brian Morris, Alexandria Malone, Karen Miller, John Delibos and Alternates Justin Maffett, Debbie Smith, Herman Walker, Roger Haywood, Harry Williams, Geraldine Ramirez, and Robert Mikes; Representing 13 At-Large Jacqueline Ingram, Dontae Scott, Robert Torres, Eric Hilbrecht, Christopher Lee, Lois Greene, Donna Darden, Anita Wood, Nancy Ramirez Ayala, Brittany Bowling, Monica Gresser, Carrie Cox, Eric Jeng, and Alternate: Irene Boylan; recognize the appointment of one member to CDAC made by the participating city Jeff Alpert, North Las Vegas; and appoint a Chair for the committee.

Summary:

Clark County's Urban County CDBG Consortium for FY 2020-2023 includes the unincorporated County, Boulder City, and Mesquite. The Cities of North Las Vegas, Las Vegas, and Henderson elected not to participate in the CDBG consortium agreement. However, the City of North Las Vegas will continue to participate with the county's HOME Consortium for FY 2020-2023.

An ordinance was adopted on October 20, 1981, creating a citizens advisory committee to enhance public accountability during the CDBG, ESG, and HOME program planning, application, and implementation phases. MIR 5470, issued August 27, 2009, explains the role and purpose of the CDAC, including its long history of citizen involvement and participation.

The CDAC consists of a potential 36 members (not including optionally nominated alternates): a representative from each of the nineteen (19) TAB and CAC and fourteen (14) at-large members appointed by the Commission. CDAC membership also includes one representative

from each of the three (3) participating cities of North Las Vegas, Boulder City, and Mesquite that serve as non-voting members.

The Indian Springs TAB, Lone Mountain CAC, Lower Kyle Canyon CAC, and the Red Rock CAC elected not to designate representatives for the CDAC this year, keeping the CDAC membership to 26. The TABs from Bunkerville, Moapa and Moapa Valley will make nominations at the next available opportunity to meet. Any future nominations will be included in a subsequent agenda item.
