Phase 2: Programs greater than \$100,000 providing immediate response and recovery services implemented within 90 days




Phase 3A & 3B: Programs and projects greater than \$100,000 providing long-term investments needed to respond and recover from the pandemic


Established in 2005 and operating as Nevada's only statewide Recovery Community Organization (RCO) providing peer support services, education & training, and advocacy & awareness.

• The Problem:

- Nevada was ranked number one in additional projected deaths of despair per capita between 2020-2029 at a rate of 47.8 per 100,000 due to the COVID pandemic.
- The most recent CDC report estimates 106,669 Americans lost their lives to fatal drug overdoses during 2021. This equates to roughly one overdose death for every four COVID-19 deaths in 2020.
- Over 400,000 Nevadans who were in need for treatment for the most misused substances did not receive it.

• ARPA Proposal:

- Expand recovery support service programs in Clark County.
- Expand overdose prevention programming and public health information to residents of Clark County.
- Enhance recovery community center to include additional functional spaces for new services and community partners.
 - E.g. atrium & a community health consult room.
- Total Awarded = \$300,000







Overdose Prevention Ambassadors

- Worked with AG's office and NV HIDTA team to target zip codes in Clark County with highest rates of overdoses
- Recruited 84 Ambassadors for tabling, training, and canvassing these areas.



ARPA Program Outcomes

Our evidence-based Kinship Navigator Program provides targeted support, information, resources, and case management to help vulnerable kinship families stabilize and improve the quality of life for children.



In 2022, the Kinship Navigator Program served 1,728 unique kinship families in Clark County.

206 were served through ARPA funding with in-home services that targeted low-income, non-child welfare-involved kinship families across the county.

Over 8,000 basic need items were distributed to families-836 to families funded with ARPA.

Families met safety, stability, and nurturing outcome goals through the following objectives:
