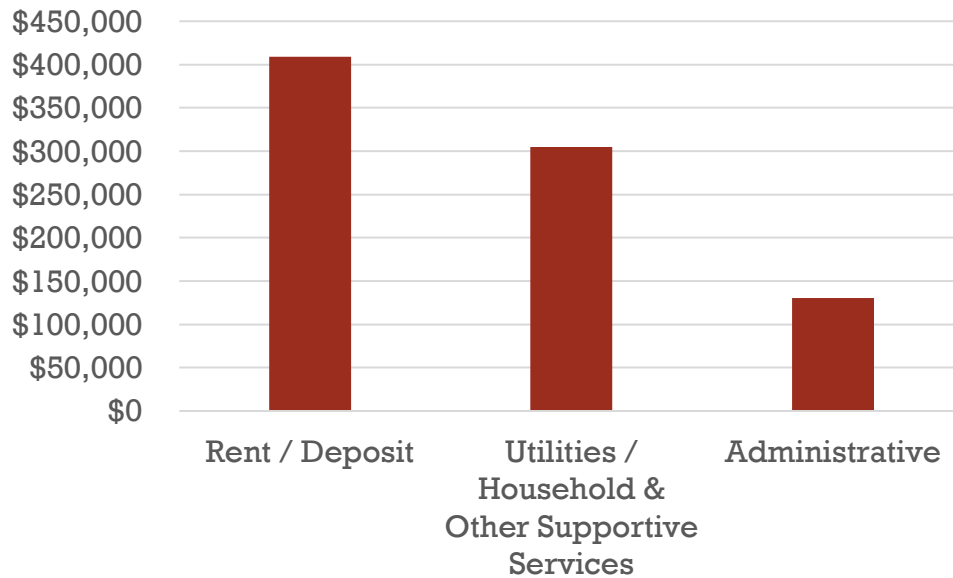

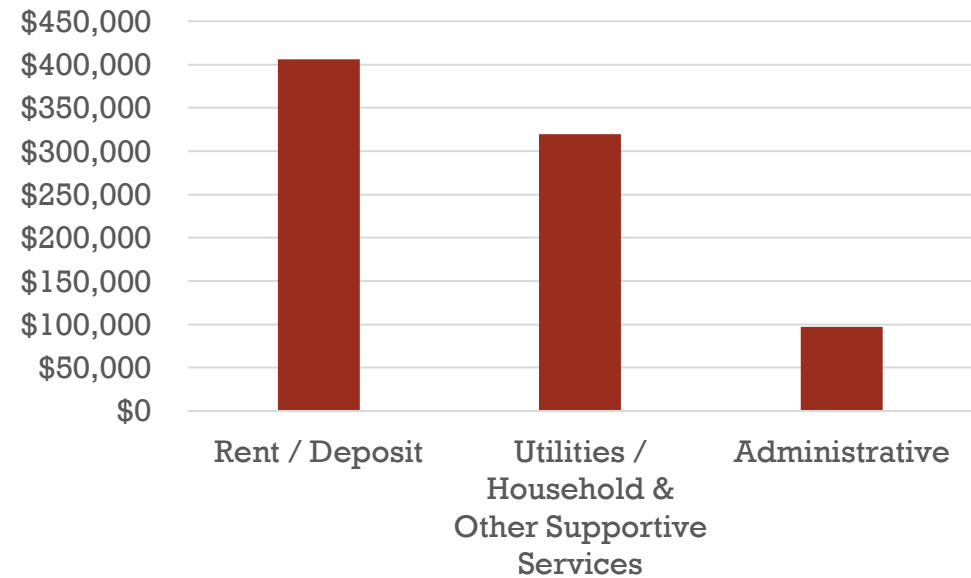

OUR GOALS: MET!

Each year, our goal is to serve 60 families when at full capacity.

From 9/1/19 through 12/31/21, we served 154 unique families and 514 unique individuals.

In this time, 78 families successfully graduated (someone who takes over their monthly expenses & doesn't return to homelessness).

100% of our families live at 30% below the Annual Median Income (\$22,500 for a family of four).

FY 2020 – 2021

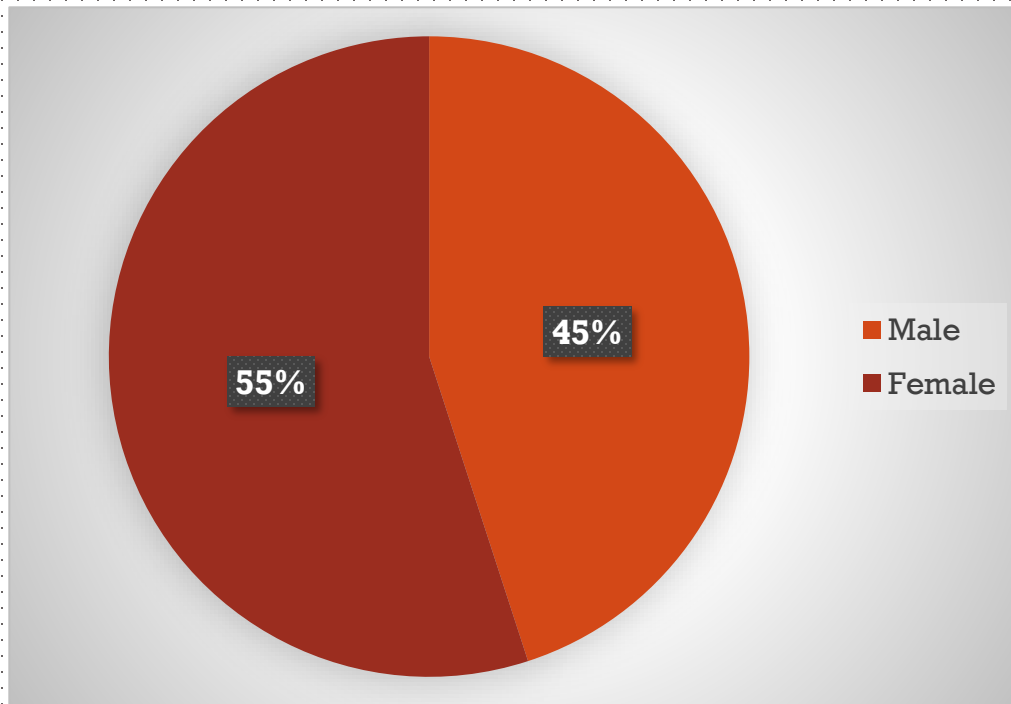
To date, no one has returned to homelessness

Current recidivism rate = .026%

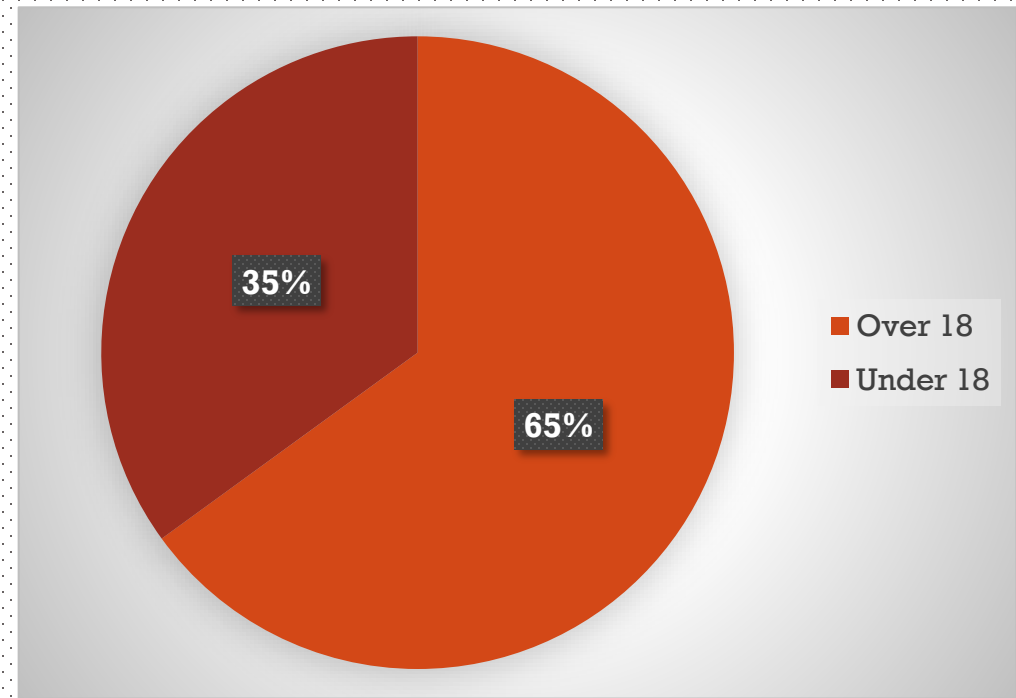


CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS

GENDER

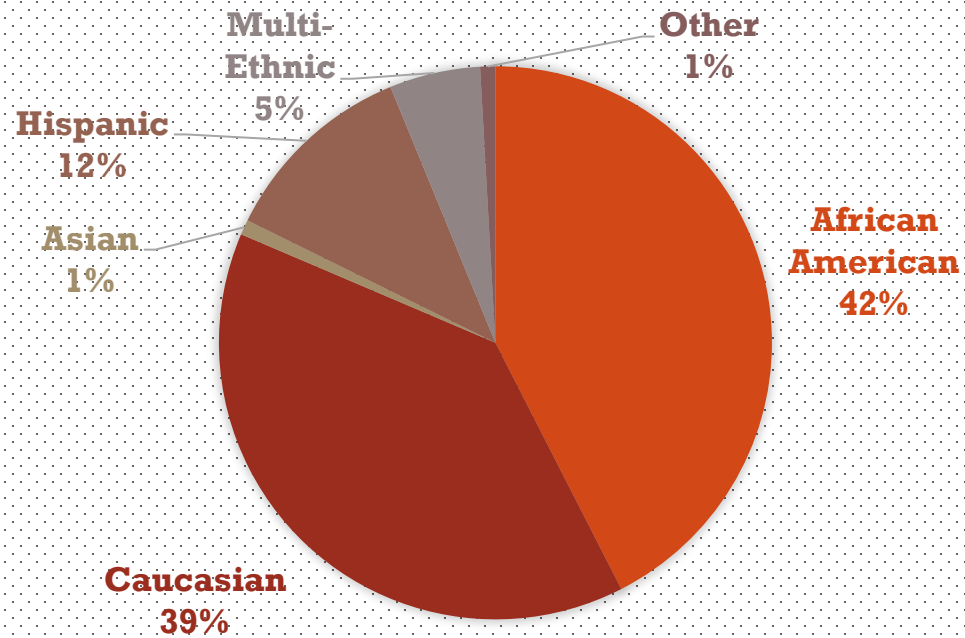


AGE GROUP

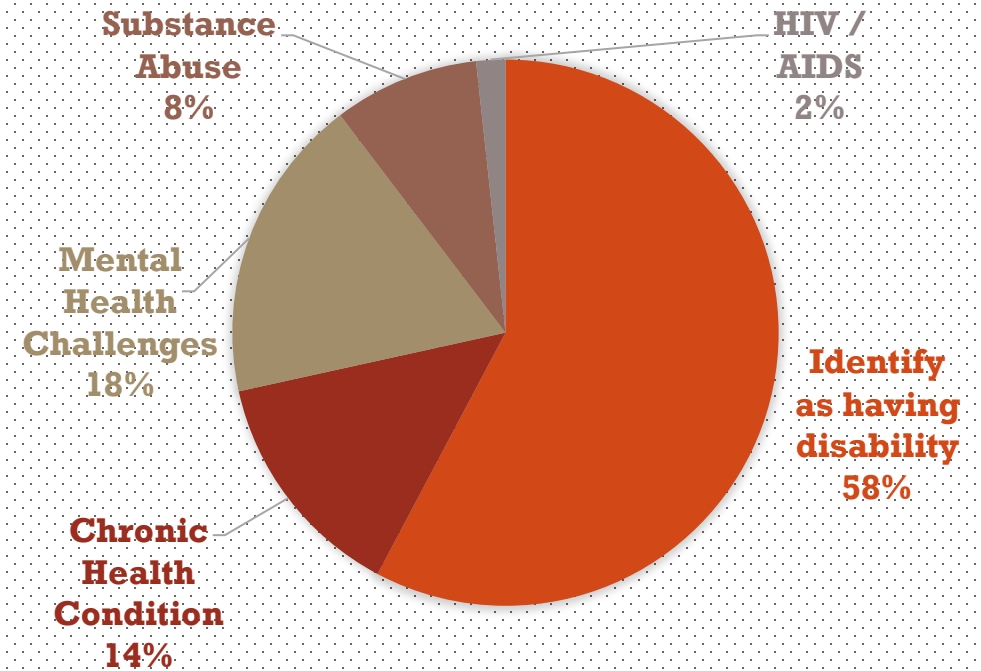

STORY OF HOPE

SARAH & HER FAMILY

First, she lost her job due to COVID shutdowns. Then, her husband filed for divorce and left her to care for their three children. Finally, Sarah was faced with the pending loss of her home due to her financial situation and lack of any financial support from her ex-husband. It's hard to find any hope when you feel like you're living in a house of cards about ready to collapse on top of you.

Despite receiving unemployment benefits and then finding a wonderful, salaried job, it wasn't enough for her to catch up on her past due balances.

Because of the generosity of private donors and grant funding we've received this year, HopeLink was able to assist Sarah by paying two months' rent to bring her current with her landlord. We were also able to qualify her for food and utility assistance. Sarah is utilizing this time to find an apartment for her family that she can afford on her current income and has put in for low-income housing.
