2021 ANNUAL OPERATING PLAN Clark County, Department of Juvenile Justice Services Spring Mountains Youth Camp

This operating and financial plan is made and entered into by and between the Clark County Spring Mountains Youth Camp; hereinafter referred to as SMYC and the USDA Forest Service, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest Spring Mountains National Recreation Area; hereinafter referred to as the Forest Service; under the provisions of Participating Agreement, 17-PA-11401705-005, signed on 07/13/2017.

This operating and financial plan becomes part of the Participating Agreement and will be replaced annually and may be supplemented by additional projects.

Previous Year (s) Carry-over: \$13,961.87
Current Fiscal Year Obligation (Exhibit B): \$9,990.00

FY 2021 Total Annual Operating Plan: \$23,951.87

The parties hereto agree to the following:

I. PURPOSE:

A. The purpose of this Operating Plan is to identify the 2021 project to be completed on the Spring Mountains National Recreation Area, Humboldt -Toiyabe National Forest.

SMYC will provide eight crews totaling approximately 52 youth with supervision and transportation on each working day during the scheduled 2021 season starting on the date of last signature of this Annual Operating Plan.

The Forest Service will not be billed for any services that SMYC provides to other agencies or parties.

The Forest Service will provide training to SMYC Forestry Crew Supervisors and crew members as applicable. This training will include trail maintenance and reconstruction techniques and standards, proper tool use, maintenance and safety, and minimum impact land use ethics and saw training. Basic outdoor safety and awareness will also be discussed.

B. COMPENSATION will be based on an eight (8) hour youth day and charged at \$15.00 per day. Funds in the amount of \$23,951.87 are to be made available for the 2021 Annual Operating Plan (AOP) as stated in Exhibit B- Financial Plan.



SMYC will provide an equipment and supply inventory accounting to the U.S. Forest Service. A list of equipment and supplies needed for the upcoming field season will also be provided at this time. Please refer to section W. in the Participating Agreement – Government Furnished Property.

PAYMENT/REIMBURSEMENT. For Modification 001, the U.S. Forest Service shall reimburse SMYC for the U.S. Forest Service's share of actual expense incurred, not to exceed \$23,951.87 as shown in the Financial Plan-Exhibit B.

II. Preseason Work Projects (potential projects):

- a. Shoveling snow at the SMVG, desert view and sawmill
- b. Shoveling snow at Fletcher View and Kyle when operating
- c. Lee meadow litter cleanup
- d. Telephone canyon and SMVG trail maintenance
- e. Lovell canyon cleanups
- f. SMVG and trailhead restroom cleaning
- g. Trail logging out and project identification prior to summer season
- h. Mary Jane Trail maintenance when snow is gone

III. Summer Work Projects:

a. Develop Site Maintenance

Twice a week (Mondays and Thursdays) two crew will complete developed site maintenance at the following trailheads and picnic sites:

- Mary Jane and Trail Canyon Trailhead
- Cathedral Rock Trailhead
- Fletcher Canvon Trailhead
- Deer Creek Picnic Area
- Sawmill Picnic Area and Trailhead

Once a week (Tuesdays) two crew will complete developed site maintenance at the following trailheads, campgrounds and picnic sites:

- McWilliams Campground
- Old Mill Picnic Area
- Hilltop Campground
- Fletcher View Campground

Developed Maintenance tasks includes:

Picnic Sites

Tables -Wipe off table tops and benches, remove any graffiti with graffiti remover, and brush off any spider webs on the underside of tables.

Charcoal Grills - Remove all charcoal and wood from grills. Do not place hot coals in trash.

Table Pads - Sweep off any debris from concrete table pad.



Litter – Pickup any litter around picnic site.

Restrooms

Risers - Clean risers using an equal part solution of water and Pinalen or SimpleGreen, making certain there are no deposits on the surface of risers or lids. Walls and Windows - Wipe off any debris and brush off spider webs. Remove all graffiti.

Vents - Clear vents so there are no obstructions.

Floors – Mop floors using soap and water or equal part water and Pinalen solution or SimpleGreen.

Toilet paper - Restock toilet paper. Each toilet paper holder is designed to hold three rolls.

Trash cans – Empty trash cans in dumpster and replace with new bag.

General Site

Kiosk – Brush off any spider webs, remove graffiti.

Benches – Brush off any spider webs, remove graffiti.

Walkways – Sweep off debris and trim back any vegetation growing over sidewalks.

Parking Lots - Pick up any litter in parking area.

b. Trail Maintenance

Tread work- scraping tread, raising trail bed, and correct slope issues, fill in cuts with rocks/logs, remove rock debris.

Repair switchbacks.

Drainage features- install new drainage controls as needed/identified. Repair existing drainage (i.e. clean out water bars and dips)

Brushing- remove/cut back vegetation to trail standard as required.

Logging- remove down trees across trail as needed.

Signage- maintain directional and information signage along trail.

Trash pickup and graffiti removal.

c. Fuels Reduction

Fuels reduction projects as needed through coordination with the FS fuels AFMO.
