2 DISCUSSION OF LIQUOR DELIVERY BACKGROUND

 The ability to offer curbside pickup and/or home delivery of alcoholic liquor was granted on a temporary basis to Package Liquor Stores as a result of the COVID-19 Pandemic. Several licensed locations have indicated a desire to maintain on a permanent basis the ability to offer curbside pickup and/or off-premise delivery of package liquor to customers. To that end, the Department held several stakeholders' meetings to consider revisions to current Clark County Code regarding this issue.

3 KEY DATES

- April 7, 2020 Temporary approval granted to holders of Package Liquor Licenses to allow for curbside and delivery of alcoholic beverages on a temporary basis during the Governor's Declaration of Emergency.
- June 2, 2020 Liquor and Gaming Board issues Resolution Suspending Certain Requirements for Privilege Business Licenses
 Affected by the COVID-19 Emergency, which allowed temporary approval of licensed package liquor stores to conduct off-premise retail sales of package liquor and package beer, wine and spirit based products for delivery to the purchaser.
- February 16, 2021 Board of County Commissioners directs staff to explore the adoption of an ordinance allowing for liquor delivery by certain liquor licensees on a permanent basis.
- March 24, 2021 First Stakeholders' meeting held General discussion.
- April 6, 2021 Board of County Commissioners Meeting (Business License staff provided update).
- May 6, 2021 Second Stakeholders' meeting held Focused on Business Associations.
- June 1, 2021 Board of County Commissioners Meeting (Business License staff provided update).
- June 17, 2021 Third Stakeholders' meeting held (Discussed Delivery Protocols/Public Safety).
- July 6, 2021 Item was held until the July 20. 2021 Board of County Commissioners Meeting.

EXISTING REQUIREMENTS

- All alcoholic beverages must be in the manufacturer's sealed container.
- Delivery of the alcoholic beverages may only be made to the person placing the order.
- The licensee must maintain a detailed list of the items purchased, the names and addresses of purchasers, and the type of identification used to verify the age of the purchaser.
- All employees delivering alcoholic beverages will have unexpired Alcohol Awareness Cards.
- Third Party Delivery services are prohibited from the delivery of alcoholic beverages.

- Prohibit delivery to Nevada Gaming Commission Non-Restricted Gaming License locations (Unrestricted w/Class C Gaming).
- Additional protocols to prevent access to liquor by minors.

BUSINESS LICENSE RECOMMENDATION

Recommendations:

- The Department of Business License is not comfortable with the proposed responsibilities of the third-party delivery companies.
- The state recently passed <u>SB307</u>, which allows the DOT to enact regulations allowing for liquor delivery by "retail liquor stores or a delivery support service acting on behalf of a retail liquor store". This does NOT apply to restaurants, bars, or companies operating out of a warehouse without a retail location. These regulations have not come out yet. It makes sense to see what they look like before drafting a new ordinance regarding third party delivery.
- Therefore, the recommendation is to proceed with revisions to current Clark County Liquor License Regulation 8.20 to allow for delivery by package liquor stores on a permanent basis without the third-party delivery component.
- Revise <u>Clark County Code 8.20.360 Transport of liquor</u> to allow Package Liquor Stores the ability to deliver to approved locations and set related operational requirements.
